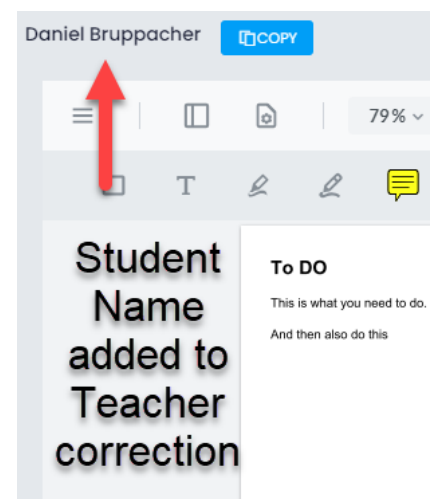

When a teacher corrects homework and has 20 students in a class, it is challenging to remember which student you are currently correcting. The student's name is displayed in the upper left corner of the Task.




Task creation improvements

When you create tasks, you often use pictures and text. You can cut and paste text and images to make it easier to create new tasks quickly. Use Ctrl +C and Ctrl+V, or use the right mouse click.





Ability to copy all text

When students are writing longer pieces, the teacher sometimes wants to spot-check if a text was copied from somewhere. Extracting the text was tedious; hence, a button to copy all annotation text to the Clipboard is now in the upper left corner.
